*) According to the investigations of the Swiss Federal Police these reports were acquired by secret agents of the Soviet embassy in Berne, Switzerland (because of which in May 1987 one of them was expelled, and in reply a Swiss embassy official was evicted from Moscow). The reports were delivered partly in writing and also verbally, and as a rule ended with the remark: «CM: Everything must be done to destroy the collective amnesia». It has not been traced if or how the reports came to be reflected in the Perestroika, though they may have furnished substantial insights. (January 1989)
